

#### **VOTING AT HOME ACROSS THE STATES**

The National Vote at Home Institute aims to improve the ease with which voters can skip the poll booth in favor of more informed, deliberative voting in the comfort of their own home. One way to further this goal is to shed light on how voters currently approach "voting at home" in their respective home states. We take up the task in this report by showcasing the array of election laws and practices governing vote-by-mail, a.k.a. "absentee" or "early," voting across the states.

Changing anything means first identifying where change is needed most, so we've organized each state along a continuum of relative access to the mail-ballot to make it easier to pin-point potential areas for reform. State policy differences are organized into distinct *state profiles* according to their existing legal and procedural rules related to voting by mail ("voting at home") in the state. Each state profile depicts a unique mail-ballot voting process, defined by three major phases encapsulated in the following questions:

- 1. How does a voter *apply* for a mail-ballot?
- 2. What are the requirements for voting, or *marking*, and returning a mail-ballot?
- 3. How does the state process and *count* mail-ballots?

Our typology comes primarily from a voting model used in three states that currently conduct all elections by mail: Oregon (2000), Washington (2012), and Colorado (2014).

State profile information was obtained from election officials at Secretary of State offices, county election offices, and relevant state statutes. The information herein is only tentative as state legislatures continue modifying their election codes in the months and years to come. At the end of each profile is a listing of voter web-resources linking to application materials and current election laws.

A report "key" on the next two pages describes the kinds of information contained in each profile and its importance to the vote-by-mail process as a whole. **NOTE: Information and dates listed are current for the 2018 General Election cycle.**
